

Preparedness outside the house

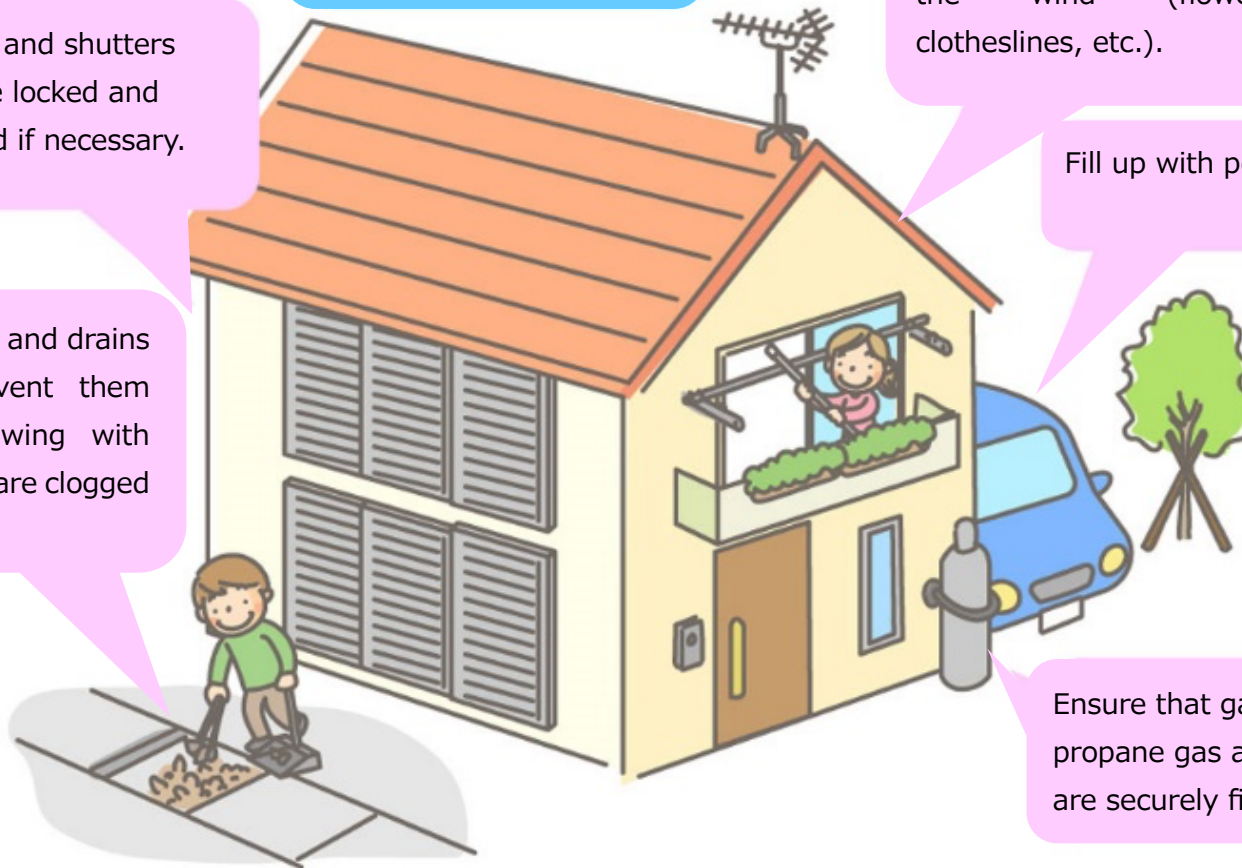
Windows and shutters should be locked and reinforced if necessary.

Clean gutters and drains well to prevent them from overflowing with water if they are clogged up.

Put items into the house that are likely to be blown away by the wind (flowerpots, clotheslines, etc.).

Fill up with petrol.

Ensure that garden trees, propane gas and TV antennas are securely fixed.

Preparedness in the house



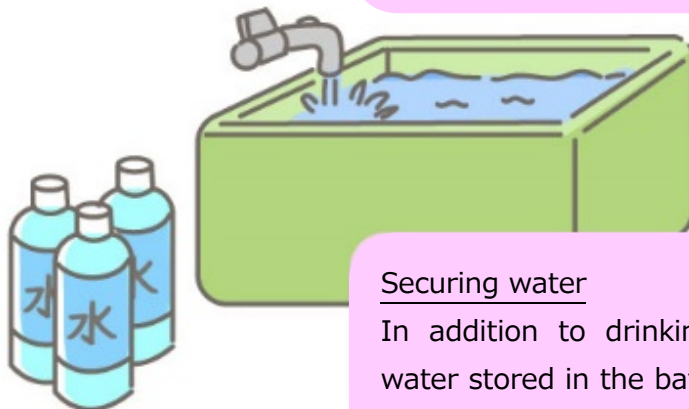
Check emergency supplies

Fully charge smartphones and computers.
